

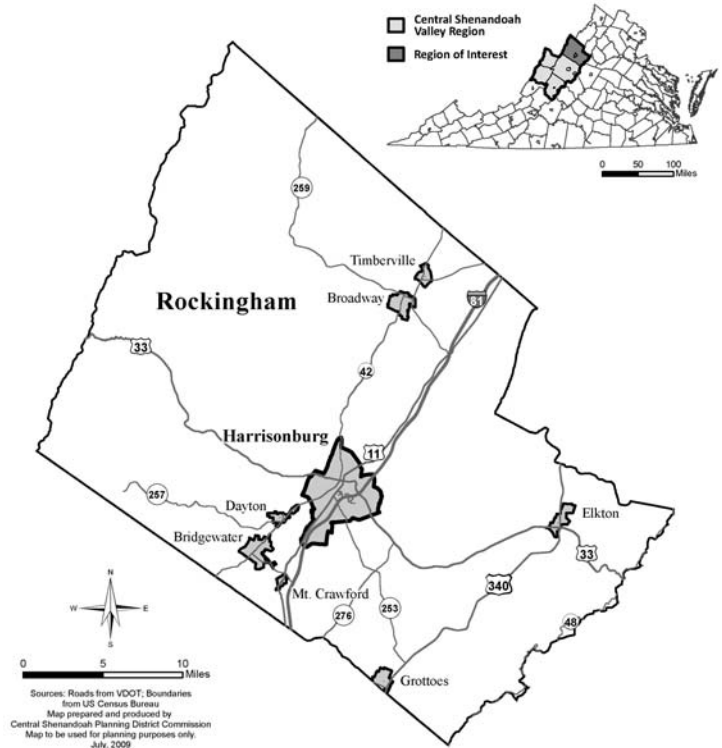

THE HARRISONBURG-ROCKINGHAM MSA (METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREA) is located in the center of the scenic Shenandoah Valley of west-central Virginia. The Harrisonburg-Rockingham MSA covers 871 square miles of land and is home to about 120,500 people. Harrisonburg, founded in 1780, is the County seat and an important education, industry, commercial, technology, and government center. Bridgewater, Broadway, Dayton, Elkton, Grottoes, Mount Crawford, and Timberville are the County's seven incorporated towns.

Formed in 1778 from Augusta County, Rockingham County is bounded on the west by the Allegheny Mountains and on the east by the crest of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Approximately a third of Rockingham County is protected by the Federal Government as National Forest and National Park land. The County is situated at the headwaters of the Shenandoah River and is bisected by Interstate 81. The Harrisonburg-Rockingham MSA is approximately 110 miles north of Roanoke, 125 miles west of Richmond, 125 miles southwest of Washington, D.C., and 68 miles south of the Virginia Inland Port.

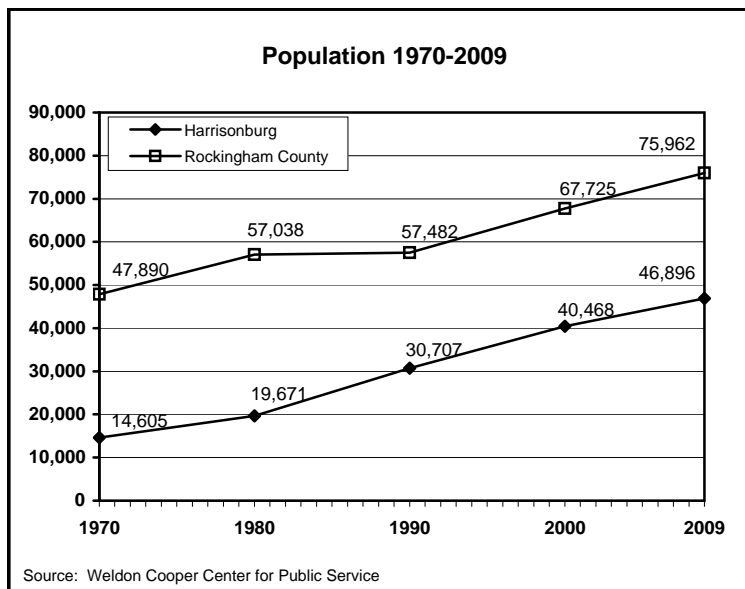

COMMUNITY

Recreation: Washington-Jefferson National Forest, Skyline Drive, Shenandoah National Park, Appalachian Trail, Natural Chimneys Regional Park, and Massanutten Resort. Local parks and recreation programs, golf and tennis courts, swimming pools and ball fields are abundant.

Attractions: Hardesty-Higgins House, Court Square Theater, Virginia Quilt Museum, Dayton Farmers' Market, Green Valley Book Fair, Harrisonburg Children's Museum, Fort Harrison House, Shenandoah Heritage Farmers' Market, and the New Market Battlefield. Local colleges and universities sponsor lectures, concerts, art exhibits, and athletic events in addition to housing museums, planetariums, and observatories.

Events: Rockingham County Fair, Virginia Mennonite Relief Sale, Shenandoah Valley Bach Festival, Dayton Days, and ValleyFest are just a few of the region's many events.

Colleges: James Madison University, Bridgewater College, and Eastern Mennonite University. Other regional schools include Washington and Lee University, Virginia Military Institute, Southern Virginia University, Mary Baldwin College, Dabney S. Lancaster Community College, and Blue Ridge Community College. Virginia Tech and the University of Virginia are nearby.

Healthcare: Rockingham Memorial Hospital provides healthcare services.
